## **School Lunches for September**

If your child is leaving Bishops Down then please ensure all outstanding monies owed to the school have been paid; if you are unsure of the amount outstanding, please speak to Mrs. Norman in the Finance office. Current Reception parents are asked to complete the form and return it to the office. Children moving from Reception to Year 1 in September will order meals in the same way as the rest of the school by telling their teacher at morning registration what they would like to eat each day. Parents can find a copy of the menu on the school website so the choices can be discussed with your child in advance.

## **Festival of Writing**

This week the whole school has immersed itself in the enjoyment of writing! The week began with a whole school assembly and a visit from our literacy Governor, Jim Watson who was the inspiration behind the festival. Children wrote spontaneously by using several inspirations for their writing - including Mrs. Spoor running into the hall and screaming and then making a quick exit - children then had to write what they thought had just happened!

Chestnut shared their writing with Year 5 and they had written about Mrs. Cleveland turning into a frog. Redwood had written play scripts about staff members who were competing in the Summer Olympics and then acted them out.



### ***Olympic Torch Relay***

Parents who are taking their own children to see the Olympic Torch Relay on Tuesday can collect their children from 10.15am. ***Please go directly to your child's classroom where you will need to sign them out.*** Pupils in Years 3 to 6 who are not being taken by their parents will be leaving school with their class teacher at 10.30am. Parents are welcome to walk with their child's class if they wish. Any children who do not come into school for morning registration will be marked as having an unauthorised absence unless they are ill, or have a medical appointment which we are already aware of. If your child is being taken out of school by another parent, this should have been clearly written on the permission form and therefore the teacher will know. If we have not been told that another parent is taking them, that child will not be allowed out of school. Children will need to be back in school for afternoon registration which is 1pm for Years 1, 2 and Reception, and is 1.30pm for Junior children.

Finally, we hope that when it does come you all have a wonderful summer break. Don't forget that the first day of the Autumn term for Reception to Year 6 is Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> September.
