## **Lost Property**

### **Governors Report**

With the building works now complete, we would like to thank the staff for all their hard work over the summer to get the new rooms ready in time for the school year. Special thanks to our Site Manager Mr Beaton for all the extra hours he put in on this project.

Following a recent change in legislation, there have been some changes to the constitution of the Governing Body. This year, Lynne Russell continues as Chair of Governors, and Stuart McTavish has been elected as Vice-chair. The remaining 11 Governors are representatives from parents, staff, the Local Authority and the Community. Angela Applegate has now completed her four-year term as Parent Governor, so there is now a vacancy for a new Parent Governor. More details on how to apply have been distributed this week on Parentmail, and we look forward to welcoming a new member soon. Angela remains on the governing body as she has been co-opted by the governors for a further four years. As well as sitting on one of three key committees (Standards, Strategy and Resources), all Governors work in Partnership with Staff linked to specific subject teams. As Governors we visit the school to discuss with teachers their plans for those subjects throughout the course of the year, and to assure ourselves that the school development plan is being fully implemented.

In addition to being linked to specific subjects, Gilly Shankland is the Governor responsible for Children with Additional Needs, and also Children in Care. Lynne Russell is responsible for Child Protection issues. As we welcomed our 60 pupil intake for the third time this year, you will no doubt be aware of the uncertainty for future expansion. The Local Authority had made the decision to revert to an intake of 30 with effect from September 2013; however, following a complaint, the Schools Adjudicator over-ruled this decision in the summer. We have been advised by KCC that they do not plan to dispute this ruling, and will be applying for the necessary planning consent to provide an additional classroom. We are waiting to hear if this planning application is approved but in the meantime, please do be assured that Staff and Governors take their responsibility to existing pupils seriously and remain focused on their needs.
