### **Music Lessons**

We are trying to find out what further demand there is amongst you for music lessons for your children. Presently we are able to offer piano, 'cello and violin lessons through the Kent Music School, and guitar lessons through SCAMPS. In addition, we are now providing curriculum keyboard sessions to Year 3 in partnership with Tunbridge Wells Girls' Grammar School and hope to build on this by providing drum and ocarina lessons to classes in Key Stage 2. If you are interested in accessing further lessons, please let the office know by returning the form below by next Friday 6<sup>th</sup> February. Obviously the school will look at your requirements and investigate any further lessons where possible.

Also, in November, 'SCAMPS' came to the school and gave a presentation to the pupils promoting guitar lessons. Sadly, only 2 children were signed up and another 2 are needed to make this viable. Please include this on the form if you are interested.

Please note that if your child is late to school they must be signed in via the office in the morning in order to ensure that accurate records of children on site are kept. Children should <u>not</u> be brought into school after 9.00am via the playground gate. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

#### Sever Weather Conditions

Heavy snow is expected on Monday. The school will stay open if at all possible. KCC advice is:

<sup>1</sup>Parents and carers have the responsibility of getting children/pupils to and from school safely and need to decide if the journey is safe when severe weather affects transport and/or walking conditions. Parents/carers should inform schools if their child is absent due to severe conditions making the journey unsafe. If your child has a disability and/or learning difficulty your decision to take the journey must take this into consideration. **Please consider carefully and only keep children at home if conditions are unsafe**.

On occasions, schools will need to close and a message will go out on Local Radio if the decision is made before 7.00am. Local Radio information is given out on BBC Radio Kent, Invicta FM and KMFM. If on the rare occasion school closes at a time within the school day, parents/carers will be informed by telephone.

Late opening and/or early closure is a possibility in poor weather conditions and schools will either inform parents the night before or via the Local Radio.

If conditions worsen in the school day and parents feel it is absolutely necessary to collect children, the school should if possible be contacted prior to collection. Please avoid collecting children before the end of the day unless you feel their safety is at risk.'

Should school have to close we will endeavour to send a text message via ParentMail as early as possible. Otherwise, please check local radio for advice.
