
20 Ways you can help your PSA

- Read the PSA newsletters and notice board.
- Attend the PSA meetings. (You do not have to be a committee member to attend the meetings.) Join the PSA Committee.
- Support your PSA by attending the PSA events.
- 4. Donate your old mobile phones.
- 5. Always buy raffle tickets sold by the PSA!
- 6. Volunteer to help at an event by, for instance, running a stall, setting up, clearing up, bartending or serving food.
- 7. Volunteer to help with the organisation of an event. It doesn't matter if you can't help on a regular basis, or even if you can't come into school. There are always tasks that can be done from home if you have half an hour to spare e.g. wrapping gifts, preparing raffle tickets etc.
- Onate goods for raffles and stalls especially on non-uniform days.
- 9. Provide discounts for goods and services.
- 10. Let the PSA know if you have a specialist skill such as cake making, jam making, marketing, DIY Skills, computer skills or artistic skills. The PSA requires a wide range of skills so don't be shy; let us know what you can do.

- **11.** Let the PSA know if you have access to specialist services such as printing, entertainers, catering.
- 12. Let the PSA know if you have successfully run an event for another organisation which you think the PSA could replicate. (You won't be made to organise it!)
- 13. Give the PSA new ideas which will help us achieve our goals.
- 14. Help us gain the support of local businesses.
- 15. Find out whether your company offers a £ for £ matching scheme (see page 8) and what you have to do to take advantage of it. And then volunteer to help at an event.
- Raise funds through shopping (see page 5&6): shop with the retailers with whom the PSA have teamed up.
- 17. Book your holiday and travel using easyfundraising website (see page 5&6). The website features over 60 travel companies.
- 18. Use Easysearch as your search engine and earn 1p for each search for the school (see page 7).
- 19. Take part in the 200 club (see page 3).
- 20. Recycle your school uniform; donate clean second-hand school uniform to the PSA for us to sell at the second hand school uniform sales starting later this year. (Look out for further information in forthcoming PSA newsletters.)

The PSA is about much more than just fundraising. It exists to provide closer links between home and school, and is an excellent way to bring staff, parents and carers together socially in support of the school whilst working towards a common goal.

All parents and members of the school community can get involved if they want to, even if they only have a small amount of time available, and all parents are automatically members of the PSA when their children join our school.

200 Glub

The 200 club is a lottery organised by the school which gives you a chance to win a cash prize every month. To take part you need to become a member.

Annual membership costs £12 for each number you buy. Members do not have to be parents of children at the school; anyone from family to neighbours to friends can join.



The prize money depends on the number of members as half the money raised is returned as the prize. If every family at the school had one number each, the prize would be approximately £75.00.

The 200 club helps the PSA generate a steady income for the school and allows you to contribute regularly whilst having the chance to get your money back.

Application forms for the 200 club can be obtained from the School Office. Your membership costs can be paid monthly by standing order. 3

The 200 club is registered with the Tunbridge Wells Borough Council.

Pound for Pound Company Matching

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Raising Money through Shopping

As well as organising a calendar of events, the PSA have linked up with a number of retailers so that we all can continuously raise money for the school simply by doing our every day shopping.

Every time you shop with any one of the retailers (below), the school will receive up to 25% of every purchase.

There is no catch; it's completely FREE to use these retailers; it doesn't cost you anymore to shop nor will you receive spam as a result of shopping this way.

In fact, you can even save money as some of the retailers give exclusive discounts, special offers and even 'e-vouchers' when you shop with them.

You don't have to be online to shop with most of these retailers. The phone, fax or order form can be used as well.


Easysearch


