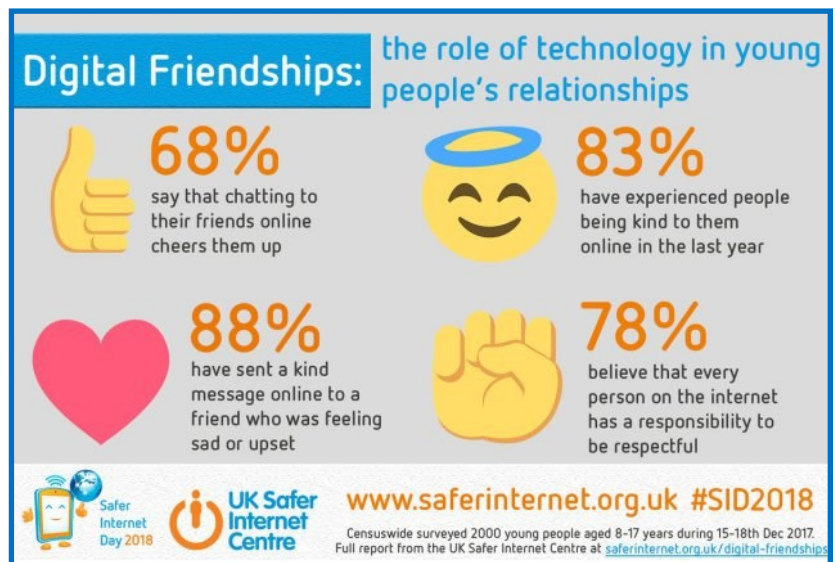
WELCOME DIGITAL LEADERS!

New Research commissioned by the UK Safer Internet Centre published about Digital Friendships

New research into [Digital Friendships](#) commissioned by the [UK Safer Internet Centre](#), has been [published](#). The research has revealed that young people are more likely to have a positive experience than a negative experience when online.

The study, which surveyed 2,000 8-17 year olds on their feelings and attitudes towards social media, revealed that despite the often-publicised negative effects of social media use, the internet plays a pivotal and positive role in how young people develop relationships and maintain their social lives in 2018.
