Sign2sing 2016

Bishops Down will be taking part in the 2016 event on Monday 1st February. For those families who are new to the school, this is a national annual event organised by the deaf health charity SignHealth and is their national fundraising and deaf awareness event.

Now in it's 6th year, it is an annual national singing and signing event that makes a difference to the lives of thousands of deaf children and adults. Bishops Down have been keen supporters of the event for many years. Your children are learning in class a brand new song they will sing and sign in a special assembly on that afternoon. The Bishops Down Makaton Masters and Oak Class are busy organising other activities happening at breaktime, lunchtime and after school and we will let you know all about these in the next week.

In addition to this your children are invited to bring in a special pair of gloves, these can be any pair of gloves, the idea is that the children can customise them to highlight the fact that hands can be a big part of communication through signing. Children will be permitted to wear their gloves, (please note not mittens, as fingers are a big part of signing) during break and lunchtime and to the assembly in the afternoon. There will be a prize for Early Years, KS1 and KS2 for the most eye-catching pair - key to remember that we need to see the signs clearly! Children are asked to bring in a donation of £1 for the charity SignHealth for wearing their gloves.
