Mrs Randell has been providing supply cover in KS1 and Early Years this term and is delighted to have been asked to join the team on a substantive basis until July 2023. On the other day, Mrs Silburn will be teaching. The children know Mrs Randell and she knows the school so this is a very good fit for us.

Severe weather conditions

I understand that there was some confusion over opening arrangements on Tuesday. Please always the assume the school is open and fully functioning unless we communicate otherwise. We will only close if we lose water or heating, or if we cannot get a safe number of staff into school.
