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
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Curriculum Enrichment

On Monday, Years 3 and 4 visited the Museum of Kent Life in Maidstone. During the visit, the children took part in educational workshops to enhance their topics. During Year 3's workshop, the children explored the technologies the Romans brought to Britain. They compared and contrasted inventions to do with bathing, road building and central heating, and created an aqueduct in competition with each other. Year 4 stepped back into Ancient Egypt to discover what life was like with a focus on dress and jewellery. The children also had an opportunity to explore the farm, gardens and vintage village. A wonderful day was had by all the children.







During their visit, the children wrote and drew pictures about what they had done to celebrate King Charles III's Coronation. These were then put into a capsule and sealed using a wax seal.
