#### ***Year 6 Safety in Action***

Then we moved onto railway safety. There was a stuffed dummy and a mobile phone on the line, with a football nearby. We had to find out what to do if we were at the position in real life. After that we had fire safety, we watched a video, and then we had an electronic quiz after it. Next we had first aid, there was a girl lying unconscious on the floor. We had to act as if this was really happening. Then we had beach safety. We learned about RLNC (Royal Lifeguard National Club), and then we were EDF Energy experts, by knowing about electricity. We were involved in a police investigation and we had to describe a crime which we saw. After this we did road safety and learnt how to cross the road. The final subject was drugs.
